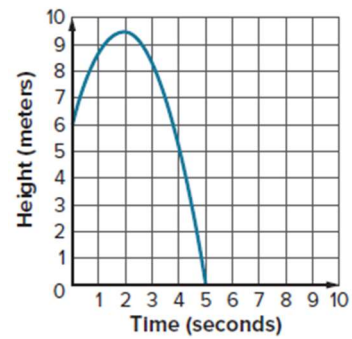
Examples 1 and 2
